Show Time

The 2018 show will be on Saturday 14th September, opening at 2pm for viewing.

If you haven't done so before then **this is your year to enter something** and have a go! All the newbies tell me they really enjoy themselves!

To get you thinking about items that need some advanced preparation, here are the titles for Art, Children's classes and Floral Art (photography classes were in the Oct 2018 NL).

Note: class numbers may change on the final schedule so please check.

Section I – Art & Craft – Open to all

Class 68 – "Colour"

Any media painting, i.e. oil, water colour, pencil drawing, pen & ink etc. or mixed media

Section K

Children aged 5 to 8 years

Class 76 - 3 biscuits decorated with the colours of a favourite superhero (biscuits can be shop bought).

Class 77 - A vase of your favourite flowers (combined maximum height 45cm).

Class 78 - A painting or drawing of a super hero, using any medium (max. size A4).

Class 79 - An 'imaginary' space creature, made from vegetables/fruits (cardboard, cocktail sticks and cello-tape also allowed).

Children aged 9-12

Class 80 - Picture or collage entitled "An ocean scene", any material (max. size A4).

Class 81 - 4 small cakes decorated with animal faces.

Class 82 - A photo entitled "Happy Birthday".

Class 83 - A seed tray scene "My Day At The Seaside". Size not to exceed 25cm x 40cm.

Section N Floral Art – open to all

Class 84 - 80 years ago the nation took up DIG FOR VICTORY. To celebrate, using a vase and water only make a design of edible material. It can be leaves or leaves and flowers. 45cm H x 30 cm x 30 cm

Class 85 - "Late Summer Symphony", no accessories. 60cm H x 45cm x 45cm.

Class 86 - 60 years ago was 'one step for man and a giant step for mankind'. Your interpretation of what you would present to the astronauts as mankind's thank you. Accessories allowed. 45cm x 45cm x 45cm.

Class 87 - A button hole for the Investiture of the Prince of Wales, 50 years ago, using colours of the national plants of Wales (Daffodils and Leeks). Accessories allowed, live material and/or dried. 4cm H x 10cm x 10cm.

RETURNING YOUR CUPS: Remember to return any cups to the store and pick up a copy of the schedule if you're not on the email list. Please do this in **early JULY**, as the store is closed during August.

If you are a first time exhibitor and would like any advice, please do feel free to give me a call or email me.
