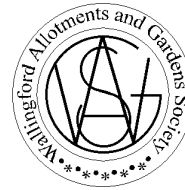

### Spring Plant Sale

This next event in the Store is on **Saturday 12th May 2012**. Sale starts at 9am. Proceeds of the plant sale are used to help run WAGS and the plants themselves give us all the opportunity to try something new and have variety in what we grow!

We hope to see you all there. There will be a good display of annuals and vegetables this year, and some perennials, kindly grown by members of WAGS.

Annuals will include:

**Geranium** (Pelargonium) - large flowers in red, rose, salmon, pink, white and orange

**Petunia** - bright pink and red grandiflora flowers, some with a striking white centre and frilly edges

**Verbena** - masses of deep red, pink and white flowers

**Lobelia** (trailing) - Mixture of mid blue, light blue, white, carmine, purple, mauve and lilac

**Begonia** - clusters of small flowers in red and pink colours on top of attractive bronze and green foliage

**Gazania** - good in dry conditions, plant in full sun. Colours are orange, yellow, white and red, with stripes and stars

We want to put on a really good sale this year, so when you are sowing your annuals and veg, think of WAGS and sow a few extra seeds to bring to the sale.

**Bring your surplus plants to the Store** on the evening of **Friday 11th May (between 6 and 7 pm)** or before the sale on Saturday morning. Please label your plants clearly for the benefit of buyers! Do also get in touch if you can help on the day.

### ***Come with WAGS to the RHS Gardens, Wisley***

As the days start to warm up, you may want to think about the next WAGS outing on **Sunday 10 June 2012** to the Royal Horticultural Society Gardens at Wisley. By June, the gardens should be giving us a great display.



The Bowes-Lyon Rose Garden opened to the public in July 2011. Featuring more than 4,000 roses and 5,000 herbaceous plants, the garden is designed by RHS Chelsea gold medal-winning designer Robert Myers and is composed of a series of gentle terraces that step down from the Bowes-Lyon Pavilion. A river of roses runs round circular lawns.

As an RHS Affiliated Society, we get **free** entrance, so all you pay for is the cost of the coach: **£15 per person!**

The coach will leave Wallingford at 9.30 am from outside the Library, returning to Wallingford by 5.30 pm

It promises to be a great day out!

### ***Show Time***

As you know, in 2010 I entered the show for the first time and loved it, and then in 2011 I was Show Secretary for the first time and loved that too.

We really value those of you who enter our show every year and put so much effort in. For members who haven't entered yet, I hope you are thinking "Yes this is the year I WILL enter something and see how I do."

To get you thinking about the items that need some advanced preparation, here are the titles for Art, Photography and the Children's classes:

#### **Section I – Art & Craft – *Open to all***

Class 67 – Art entitled "*A Countryside Celebration*"

Any media painting, i.e. oil, water colour, pencil drawing, pen & ink etc. or mixed media.

Class 68 – A hand-made item not exceeding 60 x 60 cm (24" x 24") – no height restriction.

#### **Section J – Photography – *Open to all***

69 Colour Print entitled "*Beauty*"

70 Colour Print entitled "*Britain's heritage*"

71 Colour Print entitled "*Sunshine*"

72 Colour Print entitled "*Nature*"

73 Colour Print entitled "*Water*"

Maximum size of print 18 cm x 13 cm (7" x 5"), un-framed, un-mounted.

#### **Section K - *Children***

*Children aged 5 to 8 years (i.e. have had their 5<sup>th</sup> Birthday but not their 9<sup>th</sup> on the day of the show)*

Class 74 – 3 biscuits decorated with a Royal theme (biscuits can be shop bought)

Class 75 – A picture of the Queen at her Diamond jubilee, any medium (max A4)

Class 76 – A collage entitled "*A Royal Gardener*" made from natural materials (max A4)

Class 77 – A 3D 'vegetable' creature, going to a Diamond Jubilee event (using only natural materials)

*Children aged 9 to 12 years (i.e. have had their 9<sup>th</sup> Birthday but not their 13<sup>th</sup> on the day of the show)*

Class 78 – 4 jam tarts decorated with a Royal theme

Class 79 – A sketch of a Royal Residence, using pencils (can include colour) max A4

Class 80 – A 'Royal garden' in a seed tray (max 25 x 40 cm)

Class 81 – A photograph from a Diamond Jubilee event

The **complete Schedule** comes out in July and will detail the new titles for Floral Art. If you would like any advice on showing, or have any questions about the schedule, please do give me a call or email.
